that when we are far from him

missing from our lives. His
presence makes us feel in need of
salvation, and this begins the
healing of our heart.

Then, when our desire to be healed
becomes more courageous, it leads
to prayer, to crying out fervently
and persistently for help, as did
Bartimaeus: "Jesus, Son of David,
have mercy on me!" (Mark 10:47).
