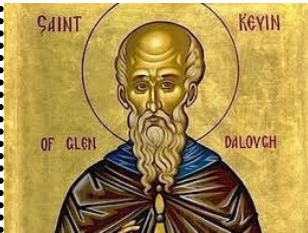

so that I will do the best that I can.

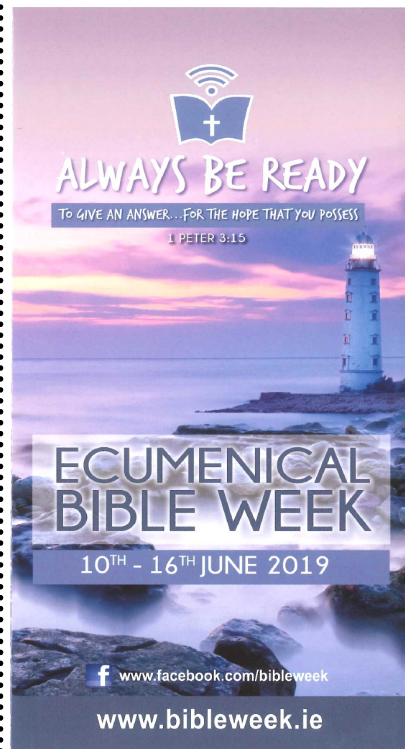
**God of understanding:**
